



Hope for intimacy Men with disabilities and the drive to be sexual

Men with disabilities almost universally face barriers to sexual intimacy and building genuine relationships. Supporting men to deal with rejection and take courage is an ongoing challenge for friends, families and disability support workers.

Russell Shuttleworth is an inspirational speaker who has done extensive qualitative research internationally into the relationship and sexuality issues facing men with cerebral palsy and other physical disabilities. He has many stories to tell about barriers men face as well as strategies that they are employing to achieve their goals, including dealing with rejection successfully. Russell is currently based with Sydney University and hails from California.
