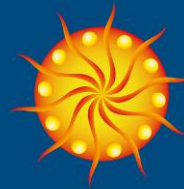

Professor Lynn Chenoweth: Dementia and aged care nursing:

In this presentation Lynn will outline two proven theoretical frameworks that guide quality dementia care: the Need-Driven Dementia Behaviour model (NDB) (Algase et al, 1997) and the Psychosocial Theory of Personhood in Dementia (Kitwood, 1993), which is the basis for Person-Centred Care (PCC). Through a series of case studies and workshop activities Lynn will reveal how:

1. dementia and aged care staff can use these models to understand need-driven behaviour, often labelled as “challenging behaviour”, which often arises from non-person-centred care practices and deficiencies in the care environment;
2. how staff can use these models to develop person-centred care and lifestyle plans that aim to meet the person's unique needs; and
3. staff can reconceptualise nursing care and therapy practices for the benefit of the person with dementia with need-driven behaviour.

Professor Daniel O'Connor: Recent research from the Collaborative Research Centres:

The role of non-pharmacological treatments of behavioural and psychological symptoms of dementia. This presentation reviews evidence concerning the effectiveness of treatments of non-pharmacological treatments of behavioural and psychological symptoms of dementia Including aromatherapy, music therapy and family audiotapes. The role of one-to-one interaction, which underpins most psychosocial treatments will be discussed.

Professor Dimity Pond: DCRC Better Practice Lead:

This presentation will discuss the results of a randomised controlled trial of GP education about dementia. The trial was conducted across 5 Australian sites including Adelaide. Results of the baseline data collection will be presented, including GP accuracy in identification of dementia, and the accuracy of our research nurses and GPs using brief screening scales. Management in terms of blood test, imaging and referral to services and Alzheimer's Australia will also be discussed. Data will come from our GP audit, and from surveys of and interviews with carers.
